Yukon is home to diverse and distinct First Nation cultures. Yukon tourists have many opportunities to learn about our culture and hear our stories. They can visit a cultural centre, attend a festival or gathering, or enjoy an on the land experience offered by one of our tourism business owners.

There are many ways for Yukon First Nations to share our stories. Perhaps you know about a cultural experience in development or you have an idea for an experience that could be shared in the future. As part of the Sharing Our Stories Conference, we invite all conference delegates to share tangible and intangible experiences and resources that currently exist, are in development, or could be developed down the road. This might include:

Special places (fish camps, trails, significant landmarks, etc.)
People (storytellers, artists, culture bearers, etc.)
Tourism business ideas
Festivals + gatherings
Art/songs/dances/stories
Cultural centres
Any First Nations cultural experience or resource that you would like to share

The result will be an inventory of existing and potential cultural experiences that may be shared with visitors. The document will be a reference point for the culture + tourism sector. It is meant to inspire ideas and create a platform from which future planning can occur. In the lead up to the conference, we encourage all attendees to think about the ideas and experiences they might like to share with us. There will be a historian and 4 Elder Advisors onsite who you can share information and ideas with.
