ATTA - Reconciling the Carbon Footprint of Adventure Travel

People working in adventure travel are passionate about its advantages over other forms of tourism for many reasons: It can provide meaning and satisfaction to travelers who enjoy engaging and enlightening experiences, and it can serve as a mechanism to preserve wildlife and nature. For businesses in areas lacking economic opportunity, it can offer a path to greater financial security. And yet, one hard fact about adventure travel is that it often involves long-haul air travel, which contributes significantly to global carbon emissions and climate change. Recently, researchers studying the impact of air travel on carbon emissions estimated tourism's global carbon footprint accounts for about 8 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions.

Issues With Commercial Parking at the Whitehorse Airport

WTAY members with **commercial plates** on their vehicles are allowed free parking in the commercial parking area at the airport. Permits to park in that area are obtained at the management office on the second floor of the terminal.

If you use a rental vehicle for business reasons, you <u>will not</u> be provided a commercial parking permit because the rental vehicle doesn't have a commercial license plate. Rental vehicles must be parked in regular parking or they will be ticketed. Tickets are paid at the Law Courts Building on 2nd Avenue. There is no leeway in this airport policy.

Due to a member recently bringing a ticketing situation to our attention, WTAY contacted the Airport Manager to confirm this policy. Airport personnel are instructed to issue tickets for any non-commercial vehicles parked in the commercial parking area. They are also required to ticket vehicles that don't have the commercial parking permit displayed. They are not allowed to dismiss the ticket.

Prior to parking in the commercial lot, please ensure that you have the required parking permit for your vehicle.

Yukon Parks Strategic Plan Survey

The Government of Yukon is developing a strategy to set long-term direction for Yukon's system of territorial parks, which includes wilderness parks, campgrounds, and recreation sites. The strategy will provide guidance on how to sustainably deliver the environmental, economic, social, and health benefits of territorial parks.

From April to July 2018 we engaged with park users, stakeholders, First Nations, and Yukon communities at more than 20 events to help us begin the process of developing the strategy.

Now we have a few specific questions to ask Yukon residents and all users of Yukon territorial parks. Your answers will help us write a first draft of a Yukon Parks Strategy. There will be an opportunity to provide feedback on that draft during the coming winter.


